

Ice Cube Painting

Materials

an ice tray

1 tablespoon flour

food colouring

Lolly sticks (craft sticks)

Paper

Instructions

Fill your ice tray with water then empty the water into a jug. This allows us to have the correct amount of water for our tray.

Whisk the flour into the water so that the ice has a less watery consistency.

Fill your ice cube tray with the flour and water mix. Add food colouring.

Put your lolly sticks into the ice cube blocks. You might want to do this when the tray is sitting in your freezer!

Freeze the ice cubes.

When your ice cubes are ready, put paper on a plastic tray or a table protected by a plastic sheet. Paint with the ice cubes!
